

17 INVENTIONS BY WOMEN

Women's Suffrage: After the Civil War there had been increased agitation among women regarding their right to go to the polls. In 1869, the 15th amendment was being signed into law, which would give newly freed black men the right to vote. Susan B. Anthony and Elizabeth Cady Stanton refused to sign the endorsement as it did not include giving the women the right to go to the polls as well. They formed the National Woman Suffrage Association (NWSA) which campaigned for women's rights at the federal level. . . . In 1918, when the 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution was written into law, it provided "The right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any state on account of sex."

Inventions by women:

- l. The car heater: Margaret A. Wilcox who invented the car heater in 1893 also invented a combined clothes and dishwasher.
- 2. Monopoly: designed by Elizabeth Magie in 1904, originally called the Landlord's Game.
 - 3. The fire escape: invented by Anna Connelly in 1887.
 - 4. The life raft: Maria Beasley in 1882 who also invented a machine that makes barrels.
 - 5. Residential solar heating: Dr. Maria Telkes in 1947. She was a psychiatrist in addition to being a solar-power pioneer.
 - 6. The medical syringe: the syringe which could only be operated with one hand was invented by Letitia Geer in 1899.
 - 7. The modern electric refrigerator was invented by Florence Parpart in 1914. She also invented an improved street cleaning machine.
 - 8. The ice cream maker: Invented by Nancy Johnson in 1843. Her patented design is still in use today.
 - 9. The computer algorithm: Ada Lovelace is essentially the first computer programmer due to her work with Charles Babbage at the University of London in 1842. In fact her notes were an essential key to helping Alan Turing's work on the first computers in the 1940's.
 - 10. Telecommunications: Dr. Shirley Jackson invented the portable fax, touch tone telephone,

- solar cells, fiber optic cables and the technology behind caller ID and call waiting.
- 11. The dishwasher: Josephine Cochrane invented it in 1887. Before her time she even marketed her machine to hotel owners and opened her own factory without the help of a man.
- 12. Wireless transmission: Hedy Lamarr, world famous film star, invented a secret communications system during World War II for radiocontrolling torpedoes. This technology paved the way for everything from Wi-Fi to GPS.
- 13. Closed-Circuit Television Security (CCTV): Marie Van Brittan Brown invented CCTV because of the slow response of police officers in 1969 to help people insure their security. This invention influenced modern CCTV systems used for police security and homes today.
- 14. The modern paper bag: Margaret Knight invented a machine that makes square bottomed paper bags in 1871. She almost didn't get credit when Charles Anan tried to steal her work claiming that it wasn't possible for a woman to create this brilliant invention. She also invented a safety device for cotton mills when she was 12. This invention is still in use today.
- 15. Central heating: Although Alice Parker's invention in 1919 of a gas-powered central heater was never manufactured her idea was the first that allowed for using natural gas to heat a home, inspiring central systems used today.
- 16. Kevlar: This life-saving material, five times stronger than steel and used to make bulletproof vests, was invented by Stephanie Kwolek in 1965.
- 17. Computer software: Dr. Grace Hopper was a computer scientist that invented COBOL, which is the first user-friendly business computer software system in the 1940's. She was also a rear admiral in the US Navy and the first person to use the term "bug" in reference to glitch in a computer system when she literally found a (bug) moth causing problems with her computer.

The "Secret" Codes on Death Certificates That Can Tell You How Your Ancestors Died

Finding death certificates for our ancestors is a critically important part of family history research. These important records contain information about when and where our ancestor lived and died and often include names of a spouse, parents, witnesses and, of course, a cause of death.

But the causes of death on death certificates are notoriously hard to read. Certainly, the more we research the better we get at deciphering the meaning of these sloppily written medical texts, but, very often, we are still left scratching our heads. Luckily there is a "secret" code on many of these documents that can help you make sense of this information and more fully understand how your ancestor passed.
